

## All Arrests - April to October 2016

Between November 2015 and October 2016 Cheshire Police arrested 19,990 persons. (An average of 1666 persons per month). Arrest volumes vary and are subject to many external factors including major events, sporting events or time of year.

**Arrests Under Section 136 of the Mental Health Act - April to October 2016**

Cheshire Constabulary strives to ensure that Police Custody is only used as a 'place of safety' under the Mental Health Act where absolutely necessary and only where a person can't be safely and effectively managed outside of this environment. Each detention is scrutinised to ensure appropriate use of Police powers and to identify areas of learning to improve on the processes in place.

## Juvenile Detentions - April to October 2016

Appropriate and necessary use of Police Custody for Young Persons (under 18 years of age) in Cheshire is a priority. All instances of Young Persons detained overnight\* are scrutinised by a multi-agency panel (Children services, Youth Offending Service, Emergency Duty Teams and Police), to ensure that the detention was necessary and proportionate in the given circumstances.

**Police Custody in Cheshire is not used as a 'place of safety' under the Childrens Act 1989.**

### Juvenile detentions in Cheshire

Cheshire police take every opportunity to ensure the arrest of juveniles (anyone under 18 years of age) is kept to an absolute minimum. In basic terms the arrest of a juvenile is seen as the last resort after all other options have been considered.

- The majority of young persons arrested in Cheshire are aged 17 years.
- All operational staff have been trained in PACE Code G, "necessity criteria" for arrest.
- All young persons will have an appropriate adult allocated to them.
- Cheshire Police provide dedicated cells for Juveniles, equipped with toilet and washbasin, CCTV and are located closest to the Custody Sgt.
- All young persons in Custody are automatically referred to the custody Health care practitioner for a welfare review.
- Young persons detained in Custody are prioritised to ensure they spend as little time in custody as possible.
- Dedicated reading material is available for use by young persons.

Total number of arrests of young persons which resulted in an overnight detention in October 2016 – 37 (2.1% of total arrests made).

During October 2016, 5 overnight detentions potentially fitted the criteria for requests to be made to the Local Authority for alternative accommodation in accordance with the established joint agency protocol. There were two requests for non-secure accommodation of which none were accommodated. There were three requests for secure accommodation, of which one was accommodated.

\*Overnight detention defined as more than 4 hours in police detention between the hours of midnight and 8am

### Arrests where strip search carried out - April to October 2016

A strip search is a search involving the removal of more than outer clothing (outer clothing includes shoes and socks), and may only take place if it is considered necessary to remove an article which a detainee would not be allowed to keep, and the officer reasonably considers they might have concealed such an article. (Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984 - Code of Practice C).
